

Regína Jensdóttir, CoE Co-ordinator on the Rights of the Child, Council of Europe

Regína Jensdóttir holds a law degree from the University of Iceland and a post graduate degree (D.E.A.) from the University of Strasbourg in international public law. Since 1998 she has been working for the Council of Europe on protecting and promoting minority languages, developing legal norms in the area of public and private law, including the Council of Europe Guidelines on child-friendly justice. Since 2010 she is the Council of Europe Co-ordinator for Children's Rights and heads the Children's Rights Division. In these capacities she follows the Ad hoc Committee for the Rights of the Child, the implementation of the Council of Europe Strategy for the Rights of the Child (2016-2021), and of the Council of Europe Convention on the Protection of Children from Sexual Exploitation and Sexual Abuse (the Lanzarote Convention).
